




I have a very special head,

My special hair is rare.








It grows not just on any head,

it's magic hair, you see.











In summer when the sun is hot,

I grow a hat of hair.






In winter when my nose turns red,

my hair can change its shape.







My hair is full of fun.






My special hair is full of love.
