le maborashe.



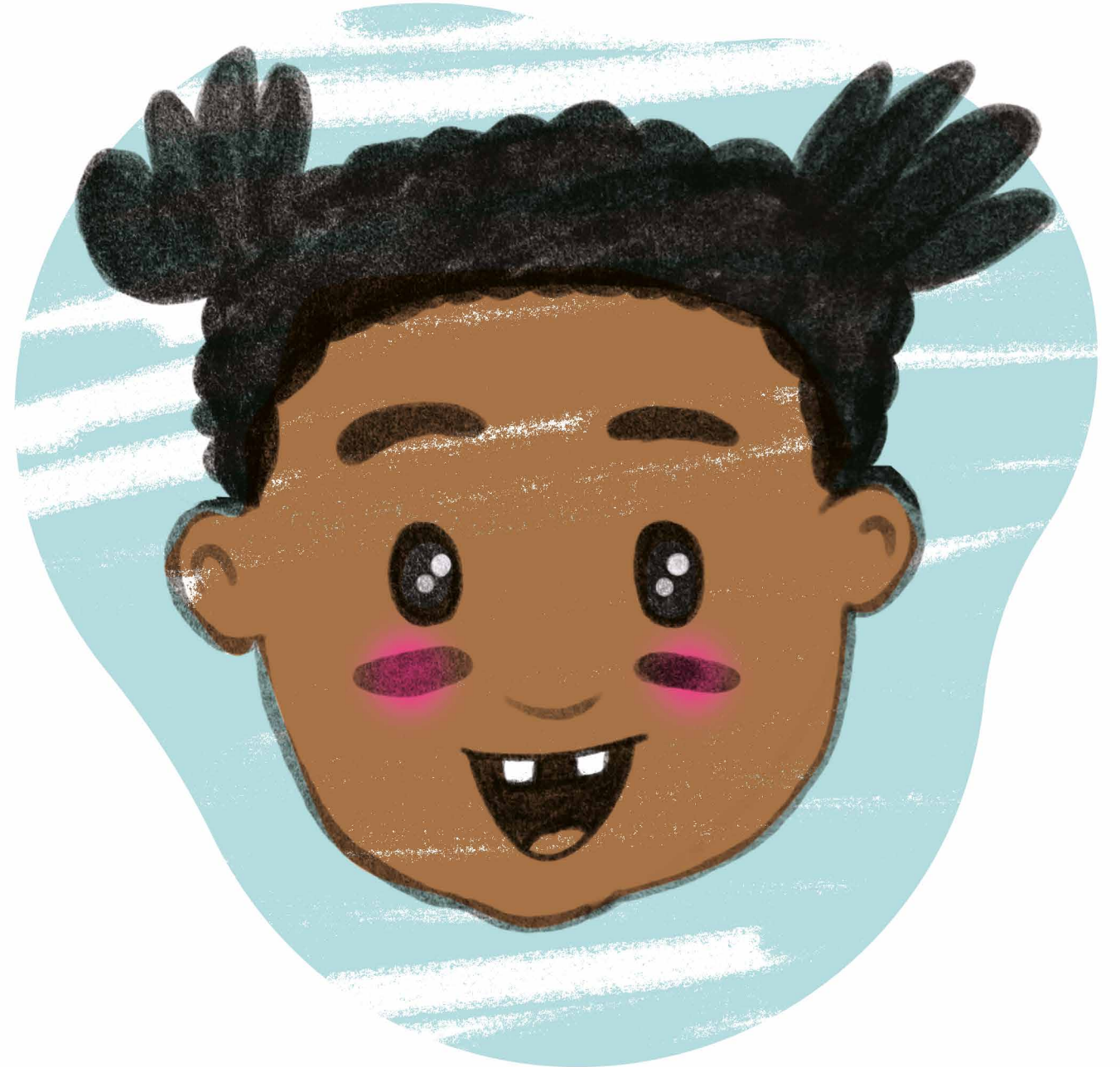
Nkgono o etsa emere ka
